

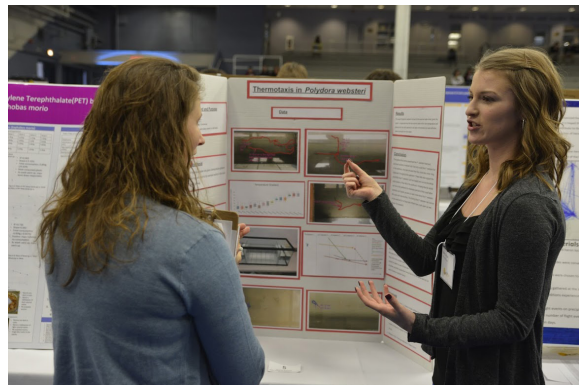


Recruiting 2018 Teacher Fellows

Maine Mathematics & Science Alliance is recruiting a third cohort of Teacher Fellows! If you're a high school STEM teacher and you'd like to bring students to the Maine State Science Fair (MSSF), this is a great way to get started.

Benefits

- Satisfaction of involving your students in their own original, independent research and engineering projects.
- Professional development at the Jackson Laboratory in Bar Harbor on July 31 & August 1. We'll cover your food and lodging. If you attend both days you'll get a \$500 stipend.
- Access to webinars, resources and assistance from MSSF staff throughout the school year.
- A \$1,500 stipend for completing program requirements, listed below.
- Reimbursement up to \$200 to cover costs associated with student projects.



Requirements

- Submit initial paperwork to join the program, including a letter of support from a school administrator.
- Oversee your students to meet MSSF form submission deadlines.
- Bring at least three student projects to the Maine State Science Fair, date TBD in March 2018.
- Complete exit interview with MSSF staff.
