WHO: We're seeking teams of three from rural Maine schools, consisting of two third through fifth grade teachers and one administrator.

WHAT: Participate in this three-year project to receive support, resources, stipends, and professional development on integrating local phenomena into your classes starting with two curricular units next year.

WHEN: Virtual professional development starts in late Summer/early Fall 2025 with teachers participating in 6 days and administrators in 2 days during the 2025-2026 year. Details about year two and three to come.
